Stan Corbitt, 63, of Temple died Sunday at his residence.

Stan was born in Amarillo November 14, 1952 to Carmac Corbitt and Nelda Beatrice Fuson Corbitt . He lived in Dalhart before moving to Temple in 1964.

He graduated from Temple High School in 1971 and graduated from the Dallas Institute of Mortuary Science in 1972.

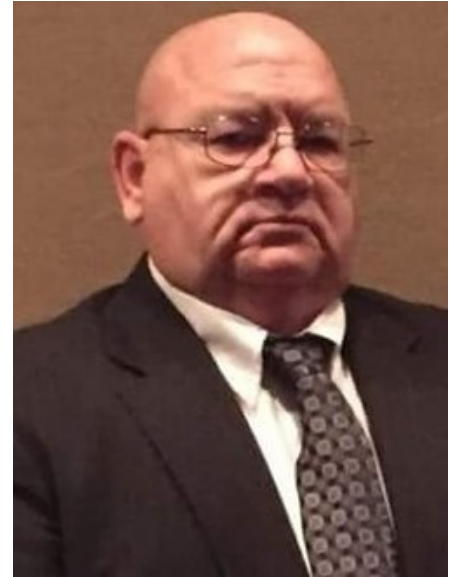
He attended Temple College and Central Texas College. He became a licensed funeral director and embalmer in 1973. He worked for Harper-Talasek Funeral Home in 1971 and Sheffield Funeral Home in 1980 and then worked for Connally-Compton Funeral Home in Waco for 11/2 years. He began working for the Temple Police Department in 1984. He had continually worked with his parents in the Maytag Appliance business at Temple Appliance Company. He worked on numerous restoration projects of antique farm engines, Model T and Model A Ford cars and gasoline powered Maytag washing machines.

Stan was a member of Texas Early Day Tractor and Engine Association and several police organizations. He served the Fraternal Order of Police as a Treasurer and State Trustee for the Central Texas Lodge #29 since 1989, and was chairman of the Legislative Committee for the Texas State Lodge for five years. He served as State FOP Treasurer for five years and State Secretary for one year then Chairman of the Constitution and Bi-Laws Committee. He also served on the Grand Lodge FOP Constitution and Bi-Laws Committee. He was reelected as State Secretary in 2012 and has served on the State Board continually since 1990. Stan worked for a number of years with the Teens Off The Streets as the security officer at The Other Side Teen Club. He helped start Final Destinations Motorcycle Escort Service. He was a certified arson investigator and accident reconstruction officer.

He attended the FBI firearms instructor school in 1990 and taught Handgun License classes, was a NRA and Firearms Instructor and he owned Stan's Firearms and Gunsmith business. Stan was a member and a deacon of the Northside Church of Christ.
